


LMC Liaison Update January 2023

Thank you for all the LMC's who have been able to provide labour and birth cares for women on the Festive List. There are still women on the festive list who will be presenting to birthing suite requiring care.

There is good news from birthing suite there are 8 new toco leads now on birth suite and 3 new dopplers which have been put on stands for use.

- Check in with your 'buddy' at a minimum of every two hours.
- This means that there is a systematic 'fresh eyes' check of every trace, regardless of whether there have been particular concerns raised or not.
- Ask your 'buddy' to complete documentation on a CTG sticker.

A reminder to call on your colleagues either core or another LMC if they are able to come and review your CTG at least two hourly. If you are unable to find anyone then you can page the ACMM to come and review.

The IOL form is being reviewed and updated. This will allow LMC's to put more information on it as to what has been discussed with women antenatally.

There are new lanyard cards available. These are for mother/baby handover, there are also the sepsis lanyard cards and MEWS pathway ones available. I will put these in the LMC corner of the ward clerk's office on Birth Suite at the beginning of next week. The fresh eyes lanyards are currently being printed and when they arrive I will put them there too.

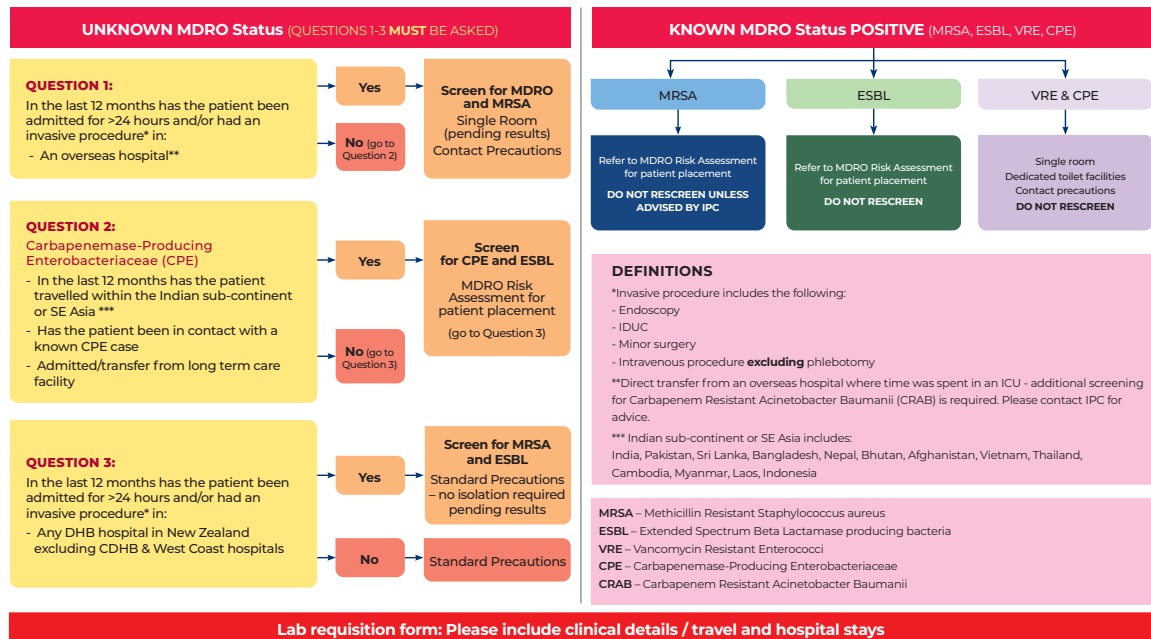

SCREENING REQUIREMENTS

MRSA SCREEN – nose, groin, perineum + wound, stoma or catheter urine – moisten swab in media prior to taking specimen – write MRSA on lab requisition form. (If previously MRSA positive, indicate this on the requisition form)

ESBL SCREEN – rectal swab with visible faecal matter present or faecal specimen – write ESBL on lab requisition form

MDRO SCREEN – rectal swab with visible faecal matter present or faecal specimen – write ESBL, CPE, VRE on lab requisition form

CPE SCREEN – rectal swab with visible faecal matter present or faecal specimen – write CPE on lab requisition form

CRAB – for screening contact IPC for advice
